

Columbia is spilling over the edge with things you can't miss! From an internationally known film festival to a place to catch some of the best acts from around the country, Columbia has it all.



THE BLUE NOTE

The Blue Note brings fun music, entertainment, dance parties, stand-up comedy, movies, and more to Columbia. The Blue Note is a beautiful theater, decked in velvet curtains with a wide array of seating. This cozy venue hosts both local and international performers, including Cody Jinks and The Fray.



If you have dreamed of visiting Arches National Park in Utah but can't make the trip, Pinnacles Youth Park might make for a great stop. With its towering arches and rock formations, it offers trails, camping areas for youth organizations, and stunning views. Visitors can also walk along a creek below the bluffs.

The internationally known True/False Film Fest resides right here in Columbia. The event showcases nonfiction films at a variety of venues in the downtown area. 



FARMERS MARKET

The Columbia Farmers Market is a year-round, producer-only farmers market. All the produce is from a 50-mile radius of Columbia. The market, which is held every Saturday, has about 85 vendors, including products that span from honey and flowers to vegetables and herbs. Besides artisans, bakers, and farmers, the market also hosts musicians and events.

MKT TRAIL

Get away from the bustling city by taking a stroll or roll down the MKT Nature & Fitness Trail. The MKT Trail, regarded as one of the best urban trails in the country, follows the old Missouri-Kansas-Texas railbed. This 8.9-mile spur trail connects Columbia to the State of Missouri's Katy Trail State Park near McBaine. Catch glimpses of birds and wildflowers while traveling through wetland and wooded areas. The crushed limestone surface makes for comfortable trail usage, whether it be walking, running, cycling, or exploring.

The African American heritage trail is two miles long and features 29 historic markers Learn more on page 24.

The restored 1880s-era home of famed concert pianist John William "Blind" Boone is open by appointment for tours and is available for small events.

Boone County History and Culture Center & The Village at **Boone Junction** 3801 Ponderosa Street 573-443-8936 BooneHistory.org

Boone Junction is a collection of four historic buildings relocated to Columbia's Nifong Park and features the fully furnished 1820 Gordon-Collins Log Cabin and the 1920s-era Easlev Country Store. The McQuitty House and the Victorian-era Ryland Farmhouse complete the village. North of the village sits the historic Maplewood House, built in 1877 and on the National Register of Historic Places.

Centralia Battlefield 19101 North Rangeline Road, Centralia Battlefield.org

One of the bloodiest battles of the Civil War occurred on this historic site Sept. 27, 1864. Confederate guerillas surprised and defeated 120 Federal soldiers.

At Columbia's historic cemetery, pioneer families of the city have been buried alongside university presidents, professors, and other prominent Columbia citizens, plus veterans of every war since the Revolution. The cemetery is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

St. Louis Arch architect Eero Saarinen designed the chapel, which features a four-foyer design and can be rented for weddings.

Francis Quadrangle captures the spirit and tradition of MU. The auad includes numerous buildings on the National Register of Historic Places, such as the Residence, where university presidents and chancellors have lived since 1867, along with the iconic Columns, all that remain of the original Academic Hall, which burned down in

Jewell Cemetery **State Historic Site** Adjacent to 2805 South Providence 573-449-7402 MoStateParks.com

Jewell Cemetery State Historic Site contains the grave of Missouri's 22nd

governor (1875-1877), Charles Hardin, along with descendants of George Jewell. There are also about 20 unlettered limestone blocks that are presumed to mark the graves of slaves owned by the Jewell family.

Built in 1928, the Missouri Theatre is mid-Missouri's only pre-Depression era movie palace/vaudeville stage and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Beautifully restored in 2008, this "gem of a show palace" features elegant decor.

COMOMUSEUMS

he University of Missouri is home to many hidden treasures, one being its on-campus museums, which serve students, staff, and the general public in their research and educational endeavors.

On Lowry Mall near downtown Columbia is the **Museum of Anthropology**—Missouri's only anthropology museum and one of only a few anthropology museums in the Midwest. The university first began collecting artifacts in 1885 and opened the doors to the Museum of Ethnology (now known as the Museum of Anthropology) in 1902.

Today, the collections include more than 35,000 ethnographic artifacts, each of which gives insight into the lives of humans who lived in North America, Africa, Asia, and South America. Some of the collections date back 2.6 million years.

This museum is located inside Ellis Library and is open to the public. Free tours are offered throughout the week from 9 AM-4 PM, Tuesdays-Fridays. Tours are available when scheduled with a two-week notice and for groups not exceeding 18 individuals.

Walk farther into Ellis Library and you will find another museum waiting to inspire you and quench your curiosity: the **Museum of Art and Archeology**.

When it officially opened in 1961, the Museum of Art and Archeology held only 14 donated old masters—famous paintings from the Renaissance period to the early 1800s. The museum has grown exponentially over the years and is now home to over 16,000 objects, including sculptures, paintings, and engravings. With art from six different continents dating from across 60,000 years, there's sure to be something to entice each visitor.

The galleries at the Museum of Art and Archaeology were recently renovated, and the collections were moved to the east wing of Ellis Library. They are now open for free tours 10 AM-4 PM, Tuesdays-Fridays and noon-4 PM, Saturdays and Sundays.

he historic Hittsville building, located at 10 Hitt Street, contains three businesses: Ragtag Cinema, Uprise Bakery, and Hitt Records.

RAGTAG CINEMA

Ragtag Cinema is a quaint, nonprofit theater that presents independent films and media art. In addition to hosting films, the theater also works alongside a community organization called the Ragtag Film Society, which aims to bring people together in the name of immersive media. In addition, each March during the True/False Film Fest, the

theater transforms into a hub for filmmakers and film enthusiasts.

UPRISE BAKERY

If visitors get hungry while viewing a film at the theater, they can head over to grab a drink or snack from Uprise Bakery. The bakery has everything from fresh baked bread to sandwiches to pizza, not to mention its vegetarian options. It also has alcoholic beverages to sip and savor. Those visiting the Columbia Farmers Market can also find bread and treats from Uprise Bakery for sale there.

HITT RECORDS

Next door to Ragtag Cinema and Uprise Bakery is Hitt Records. This record store sells both new and vintage records. Besides selling records, the store also buys, sells, and trades records, CDs, eight-track tapes, cassette tapes, and stereo equipment. It also hosts regular concerts and events.

This trio of local businesses is deeply rooted in Columbia's community, offering a theater with comfortable seating, a bakery full of sweet smells, and a record store that hosts the sounds of nostalgia.

Parks and Trails for Fun and Fitness

With more than 3,500 green space acres,

which include 75 outdoor parks and eight destination trails. Columbia Parks and Recreation has plenty of places to visit. Improvement is a continuous process, and one 50-acre gem, Smith Park, which serves northeast Columbia, features a new 0.3-mile trail along its lake in addition to its skatepark, basketball court, and a playground, among other amenities. New parking and electrical additions also amp up Strawn Park's world-class Harmony Bends Championship Disc Golf Course, and beyond its dedicated disc course, this 129-acre park is rich with natural features like woodlands and Harmony and Perche Creeks.

If walking, hiking, and bicycling are what you seek, Columbia has an extensive trail system built with these activities in mind. The more than 65-mile Columbia Trail System is a partnership—a combination of trails owned by the city, MU, and Boone County. In the mix are some dynamic, well-known trails like the MKT Nature and Fitness Trail, an 8.9-mile historic railroad spur-turned-fitness trail that connects to the larger Katy Trail State Park that traverses the state. Smaller trails thread the community and get you from point A to point B around Columbia without ever setting foot or bike tire on a road used by automobiles. These smaller trails are a part of a larger plan that will connect them to form a 30-mile loop encircling the city. To date, half of the distance has been completed, with the Perche Creek Trail being the most recent addition to the planned loop of trails.

AFRICAN-AMERICAN HERITAGE



» A Sharp Divide

Explore Columbia's African-American Heritage Trail.

ack in 2015, Columbia's African-American Heritage Trail was a dream. The idea for the trail was first conceived by Columbian James Whitt, chairman of the nonprofit Sharp End Heritage Committee, and his friend and former Sunday school teacher, Larry Monroe. Working in collaboration with Columbia Parks and Recreation and with financial support from several local businesses and individuals, James and Larry turned the dream of the trail into a reality. Today, the walking trail measures two miles and has 29 historic markers along the route, each one shedding light on an important location in the history of Columbia's Black community.

Founded in 1821, Columbia was segregated for much of its history. Black people were not allowed to shop in White-owned stores or attend White schools and churches. Out of both necessity and desire, Columbia's Black residents created "The Other Columbia," an area where they could freely work, shop, and socialize. Largely self-contained and separate from the rest of the


city, The Other Columbia covered about 30 square blocks in central Columbia on the north side of Broadway and stretched from Fifth to Sixth Streets on both sides of Walnut Street. Christened the "Sharp End," it became a thriving business center with Black-owned businesses, such as restaurants, meeting halls, barber shops, and bars. At its peak, the Sharp End served as the Black community's cultural nucleus and included churches, schools, homes, and social clubs. One theory as to why it was named the Sharp End is because its residents were expected to "look sharp."

In the 1950s, Columbia began a methodical process to dismantle the Sharp End in the name of urban renewal. Many Black homeowners and businesses were forced to sell their property, or the city had them taken by eminent domain. Former homeowners were forced to rent homes, and many Black-owned businesses never reopened.

Columbia's African-American Heritage Trail was created to honor significant local Black townspeople

and institutions from the city's first 200 years. The African-American Heritage Trail includes informative markers, such as one describing the Blind Boone Home, where the famous musician John William "Blind" Boone lived, and another describing the Harvey House, one of the few rooming homes that allowed Black travelers from the 1930s-1960s. Among the markers that reveal the Sharp End story are those that honor significant figures like Annie Fisher, who built a dining empire in Columbia shortly after slavery ended, as well as those that point out important landmarks like the Miles Manor subdivision, which aimed at creating a new Black neighborhood in the late 1950s.

Visitors can tour this historic area on foot. The tour includes stops at the few remaining buildings from the Sharp End: the Second Missionary Baptist Church, Douglass High School, and the Tibbs' Building. Explore the African-American Heritage Trail; you'll come away with a new understanding of Columbia's past.

Look west and you can spot the source of the smell, along with a full parking lot. Irene's began as a pop-up named Barbacoas Del Norte, offering Texas-style barbeque plates in 2020. When demand led them to establish a brick and mortar, Irene's owners Tim Eisenhauer and Joshua Smith set up shop in a location just between Logboat Brewing and Beet Box. Joshua is head butcher at Barred Owl Butcher and Table, and Tim was head baker there before establishing Irene's. Today you'll find a best-of-both-worlds menu chock full of barbeque and classic Mexican street food, including brisket, sausage links, tacos, and tortas. For the 21 and over crowd, there's also a rotating selection of drafts and a deftly curated array of tequila and mezcal.





Mahi's Ethiopian Kitchen

Mahi's Ethiopian Kitchen, which opened its new location in The District in 2024, serves traditional Ethiopian food, including injera: a giant gray spongy pancake-like bread, and tibs: a pan-fried beef dish. The owner and chef of the business, Mahi Tesfaye, was born in Ethiopia but and grew to love Ethiopian cooking while watching her mother cook at her restaurant in Kenya. "I learned to cook from her and all her recipes," Mahi says. Most of her menu items draw from her mother's original cooking, but are a less spicy and toned down version, Mahi says. "I cook the recipes because I know the cooking; I've been cooking them since I was a kid." Mahi's hope with her Ethiopian cuisine is that people try something new and end up loving the experience. Mahi's favorite recipe to cook and serve is the Doro Wot, which is a freshly spiced chicken stew served with injera.





Gina's Vegan a Go Go

Gina Overshiner, owner of Gina's Vegan a Go Go food truck, wasn't always a vegan. Over about a decade after being inspired by different plant-based eating documentaries, podcasts, and books—she spent her time experimenting with veganism and vegan cooking. "There are generally three prongs when people come to it (veganism), and they all kind of crossover, of course. There's health, environments, and then ethics, and so I got in by all three," Gina says. It wasn't until 2021 that Gina quit her corporate job and started her vegan food truck, which serves made-from-scratch comfort vegan cuisine. Noticing there weren't any strictly vegan options in Columbia, Gina decided to create her 100 percent plant-based kitchen. She has made it her mission to transform familiar foods, like burgers and nachos, into vegan options. "We specialize in vegan comfort foods made from scratch, like your mom would make, if she knew what vegan was, and was really cool," Gina says.


Columbia is host to a wide variety of great Mexican restaurants. but only one of them serves one of Peru's most beloved dishes: Iomo saltado. That's what inspired them to add lomo saltado to the menu. Lomo saltado is a dish with strips of beef, onions. tomatoes, french fries, and rice. This tasty entree is popular in Peru and stems from the chifa culinary tradition, which blends elements of Cantonese cooking with traditional Peruvian flavors and ingredients. Find this dish on the regular menu at Carlito's, and look for traces of Peruvian cuisine in anything that the kitchen produces.

Just Jeff's began with owner Jeff Spencer buying a hot dog cart and selling hot dogs on the campus of the University of Missouri. Jeff was unhappy at his regular nine-to-five job, and with a passion for good food and great customer service, he knew it was time to try something new. After opening the hot dog cart, sales skyrocketed. It was clear that what Jeff had started was going to be a major success. Jeff and his wife, Nicole, opened their brick-andmortar location off of the Business Loop in Columbia in 2013, where it continues to serve delicious hot dogs and hamburgers today. On the menu at Just Jeff's, diners can find classics such as cheeseburgers, hot dogs, and french fries. They can also order a local favorite, the Steak Sandwich-a houseseasoned steak with grilled green peppers, grilled onions, and cream cheese on a toasted hoagie bun, or the popular Chicago Dog-a hot dog with a steamed poppyseed bun topped with mustard, relish, onions, tomato, a pickle spear, sport peppers, and celery salt.



THE SHOPS AT SHARP END


The Shops at Sharp End is a retail store in the historic Black-owned business district. This store acts. as a host for many different local start-up businesses, allowing them to sell merchandise and gain traction as they grow. It is known as a small-business incubator—a safe space for entrepreneurs to launch their products and watch them thrive with the support of others.

When Columbia was segregated from 1900-1960, the Sharp End on Fifth Street was the only area of downtown where Black-owned businesses were allowed. From barber shops to social bars, the Sharp End served as a community gathering space and a large source of income revenue for Black business owners. During an urban renewal project in the 1950s, Sharp End was demolished, abruptly displacing dozens of successful black business owners. (See page 24 for more information on the Sharp End). Though the district no longer physically exists, its spirit lives on through the retail store, The Shops at Sharp End.

By offering training, workshops, mentoring and investor opportunities, The Shops at Sharp End continues to help minority-run businesses thrive. 

»The Logboat Expansion

Once a home brewery, this beer joint levels up to new heights.

olly Sutton, director of sales and marketing at Logboat Brewing Company, has been with the company since its beginnings in 2014. She remembers the brewery's small start with co-founders Judson Ball, Andrew Sharp, and Tyson Hunt (who is now the CEO of Logboat).

"Their dream started as three friends who were in a band together. They began brewing beer in a garage together because it was fun while they played music and then grew to brewing beer on a really large scale," Molly says. Eventually, the trio began to sell their beer. As the brews left the garage and grew in popularity around Columbia, a loyal customer base emerged. In 2014, the owners opened their first brick-and-mortar location. In 2020, coowners Judson and Andrew decided to invest in an expansion to better serve their customers.

The expansion process took a little over a year and included increasing the square footage of the inside of

the Logboat Brewing building: the bar, taproom, brewing laboratories, brewing rooms, and the tasting rooms all increased in size. "We pretty much doubled in size," Molly says. "We added what seems like a football field of new production space."

One of the most exciting additions is Logboat Brewing's outdoor space. With new outdoor bathrooms, a fenced in yard, an elevator for access to the upstairs bar, and a large covered upstairs patio, customers can now enjoy an elevated experience. One element of the patio expansion is the "shipping container bar" that allows guests to order a cold drink without having to leave the outdoor oasis.

Beyond being able to better accommodate their customers within the physical space, the owners also knew that expanding would help improve their product. When their brewing rooms became crowded, Judson and Andrew had to limit their production of special batches of

beer, which had trademarked their business when it first took off. After expanding, "we were able to do a lot of smaller batches—pilot batch beers and sour beers," Molly says. "The expansion has allowed us to put the pedal to the metal and brew the beer that we want to brew and the beer that our patrons and customers have asked us to brew."

Molly says that while the owners initially worried that the expansion process might deter customers, it has had the opposite effect. "We had all these dreams about it, and then when it was almost time to really open it up, we were like, 'Man, I hope they come back," Molly remembers. And they did. "Now we just get to get back to our roots; we get to get back to doing the things we love—bringing people together and hosting nonprofits and hosting special occasions for people and seeing our regulars on a day-to-day basis. It's been wonderful."




